The United States Olympic Museum

EIC honors the most innovative and outstanding quality merit shop construction projects produced by ABC member contractors. Safety, teamwork, and cooperation between general contractors, subcontractors, and material suppliers are prerequisites for building excellence in any construction project and this event is an opportunity to celebrate the incredible work of ABC members. The Rocky Mountain Chapter's EIC Awards, modeled after ABC National's EIC program, are the first step to compete at the national level. Merit and Excellence awards are presented within two categories, Specialty Contractors and General Contractors, and are based upon the overall scores of the judges.

This year we submitted The United States Olympic Museum for the category Exteriors. Our team was challenged with building the exterior framing and sheathing of the United States Olympic Museum. The United States Olympic Museum boasts a curving, diving, and spiraling frame that was inspired by the movement of athletes. The complexity of the design prompted us to work in a design-assist collaboration with Radius Track Corporation for their extensive experience in curved, cold-formed steel framing. Radius Track Corporation modeled, fabricated the curved material, and supplied control points for the exterior framing. Once material arrived on site we proved we were up to the task.

Our team in the field reached out to Hilti to utilize a long-range robotic total station so that we could input the precise (Northern/Easting/Height) of each coordinate that allowed them to pinpoint the placement of each stud, track, and knuckle within a sixteenth of an inch. The warped frame introduced plenty of challenges that allowed us the opportunity to prove we could lift, hoist, and contort with precision much like the Olympic heroes that will be celebrated within the walls they built.

Our team earned the Excellence in Construction award, thank you for all your hard work and dedication.

She founded the Colorado Springs chapter of the Depression and Bipolar Support Alliance (then known as the Depressive and Manic-Depressive Association) in 1994, and 4 people attended the first meeting. Today, we sponsor 11 free self-help support groups for people living with a variety of mood disorders, and their family and friends.

Along with growth and interest in its activities comes the need for more volunteers to do the work of operating the library, producing the newsletter, and facilitating at support group meetings. Teamwork is essential in our operation - if one person is unavailable or not well, another has to be ready to take his or her place. In this manner DBSA-CS builds up its people, gives them a sense of accomplishment, and offers them chances to exercise leadership among their peers, without the fear of criticism or failure. This year we donated \$5,000 to support DBSA's mission.
